REGISTER OF INTERESTS

Under regulation 8 of the Judicial Pensions Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015, the Department of Justice as scheme manager must be satisfied that none of the members of the Northern Ireland Judicial Pension Board has a conflict of interest.¹ Members of the Board must provide to the Department any information that the Department may reasonably require for the purpose of satisfying itself that members do not have a conflict of interest.

Paragraph 84 of the Pensions Regulator's code of practice for the governance and administration of public service pension schemes recommends that registers of interests should be published, for example, on a scheme's web site. This register is therefore published on the Northern Ireland Judicial Pension Board page of the Department of Justice web site (<http://www.dojni.gov.uk/Northern-Ireland-Judicial-Pension-Board>).

¹ A conflict of interest is defined in section 5 of the Public Service Pensions Act (Northern Ireland) 2014 as “a financial or other interest which is likely to prejudice the person's exercise of functions as a member of the board (but does not include a financial or other interest arising merely by virtue of membership of the scheme or any connected scheme)”.
