Dear Sir/Madam,

Thank you for your request for information dated 01 April 2025 and detailed below.

I'd like a breakdown of vehicles in use (owned / leased) within the department by fuel or energy type, e.g. petrol, diesel, hybrid, plug-in hybrid (PHEV), battery electric (BEV). I'm mainly interested in EV adoption, so if it's not possible to discriminate into the different types, ICEvBEV is acceptable.

I'd also like to know specifically the fuel type of the vehicles typically used by the minister(s) within the department for their official duties.

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 gives you two rights of access when you write to us asking for information. You have the right to know whether we hold recorded information falling in scope of your request, and you have the right to receive this recorded information subject to cost limit or exemption.

The information you have requested is provided below:

Also, a ministerial car is not assigned to the Department of Justice (DoJ). Ministers of Justice are provided with transport as part of the agreed close protection security measures supplied by the PSNI.

If you are unhappy with the result of your request for information you may request an internal review within two calendar months of the date of this letter. If you request an internal review please do so in writing stating the reasons to the address above.

If following an internal review you were to remain dissatisfied you may make a complaint to the Information Commissioner and ask the Commissioner to investigate whether the DOJ has complied with the terms of the FOIA. You can write to the Information Commissioner at:
