The objectives of the Strategy will be to reduce the level of harm experienced by victims through a restorative process, to hold offenders accountable and seek them to make acceptable and appropriate reparation. It is therefore intended to impact positively on rural (and urban) areas. The PSNI publication on Agriculture and Rural Crime in Northern Ireland shows that for offences of burglary, robbery and theft, based on geographical location, the total for rural areas is less than one fifth (18%) of these total crimes for the last two twelve month periods (1 Oct'17 - 30 Sept'18 and 1 Oct'18 - 30 Sept'19)

Whilst this publication only covers these specific offences, it is anticipated that the proportion of offences generally would show a similar split between urban and rural crime. Therefore in terms of the impact that any new adult Restorative Justice Strategy is likely to have, the significant impact will be on victims and offenders in urban, rather than rural, areas as this is where there is a greater concentration of crime.

That said, we will take account of any views received from rural stakeholders as part of the forthcoming consultation process.
