Thank you for your letter of 18 February 2014 which was treated as a request for information under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and your subsequent e-mail of 6 March 2014 which stated:

I just want to check one more thing. I am assuming tab 2 and 3 refer to individual children ie. 25,000 children visited NI's prisons in 2013.

Please see your request and our amended response below:

A breakdown of total visitor numbers each month for the last year (the most recent data available) - broken down for each month and each prison and how many of the visitors were adults and how many were children.

Please see attached information for 2013. The first tab of the spreadsheet details the <u>number of visits</u> by month and prison establishment broken down into adults and children.

These figures have been taken from PRISM (Prisoner Records Information System Management). Visits shown are all ATTENDED domestic and professional visits.



Visitors will be counted more than once depending on the amount of visits they have attended. A child is defined as being under 18 and an adult as over 18.

# Please specify if the monthly visits are unique or if children are visiting on more than one occasion. Provide both if available.

Please see attached. The second tab contains details of the <u>number of individuals</u> who have visited on one occasion or more than one occasion. The figure is split into adults and children.

A breakdown of any other information available on the visitors over that year who were children - for example where they are from (town or county), gender and age (age group). Obviously taking into account confidentiality issues and not identifying any child. It may be best to just give an overall breakdown for the year of this data (most recent year available) to prevent identification of children.

Please see attached. The third tab contains <u>details of children</u> who have visited each prison establishment. The details are further split into male and female by post code area. It should be noted that there are some records which have either no post code or an incomplete postcode.

Only the former part of the postcode has been provided, otherwise home location by street could be identified. Town or county is not always recorded.

Of the latest annual prison population - how many prisoners had parental responsibility for children? On a per case basis, please tell me how many children they had parental responsibility for, their length of sentence, gender, prison name, their age (or age group) and principal offence. If there is an issue with identification - do not provide the prison name if this helps to anonymise the data.

We do not collect information on a prisoner's parental responsibility for a child(ren).



# Does the Prison Service/DoJ hold any data on the likelihood of a child with a parent in prison, ending up in prison or offending themselves?

The Prison Service/Department of Justice do not hold any data on the likelihood of a child with a parent in prison ending up in prison or offending themselves.

# Please also send me any other statistics held by NIPS/DoJ on children of prisoners/prisoners who are parents.

There are no other statistics held by us or the Department of Justice.
