

HAVE I BEEN TRAFFICKED?

- Were you brought to Northern Ireland by force or pretence, or moved around Northern Ireland, and forced to work?
- Are you forced to have sex?
- Are you prevented from contacting your family and friends?
- When you work, does your boss keep your money?
- Are you prevented from moving around when you want?
- Have your passport or documents been taken from you?
- Has anyone threatened to harm you or your family if you do not do what they say?
- Is anyone forcing you to donate an organ?

If so, you may have been trafficked and should contact the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) or Migrant Help now (see "Who can Help"?).

YOUR RIGHTS

You are entitled to have your human rights respected. The Department of Justice (DOJ) and its agencies are committed to upholding your rights. If you are a trafficked victim we will help and support you.

WHAT HELP IS AVAILABLE?

Help is available through the National Referral Mechanism (NRM), a process that identifies victims of human trafficking in the United Kingdom (UK) and ensures they receive appropriate protection and support.

An adult will only be referred to the NRM if he or she gives their consent.

Contact PSNI or Migrant Help if you want to be referred.

ACCESS TO SUPPORT

The DOJ supports potential adult victims of human trafficking during the <u>recovery and</u> <u>reflection period</u> of the NRM. This may include accommodation, living expenses and help to access health and social care and legal and immigration advice. You will only get this support if you enter the NRM.

OTHER HELP

If you decide not to enter the NRM you may be able to get help from others including the organisations listed on pages 5 & 6. If you are under 18 support will be provided by a Health and Social Care Trust.

ACCESS TO HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

Health care, social care, counselling and other therapeutic services can be provided if you are assessed to be in need of them.

If you have emergency medical needs, Accident & Emergency units at hospitals will provide such treatment.

If you have been trafficked for sexual purposes you can receive care and support from the Sexual Assault Referral Centre. All recovered victims will be offered screening.

Health and Social Care services may be available to you even if you have not entered the NRM, or if you have been confirmed by the NRM not to be a victim of human trafficking. However, unless you have an entitlement to remain in the UK a charge may be applied.
