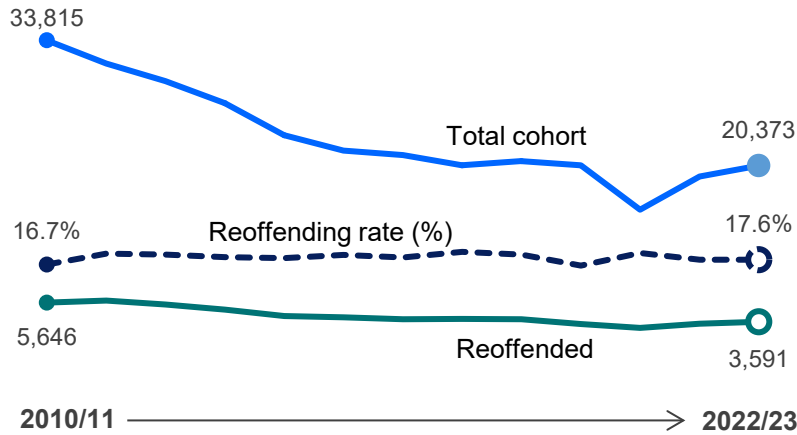


Adult and Youth Reoffending in Northern Ireland (2022/23 Cohort)

Annual Reoffending Cohort

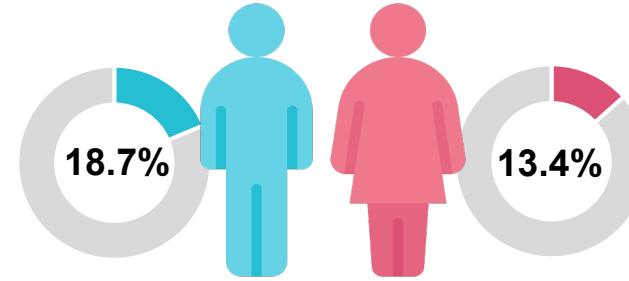


The **reoffending rate** for this cohort is **17.6%**; there has been no change from the previous year (**17.6%**)

The cohort (**20,373**) and number reoffended (**3,591**) **increased** from 2021/22

*The impact of Covid-19 should be considered when interpreting findings

Gender



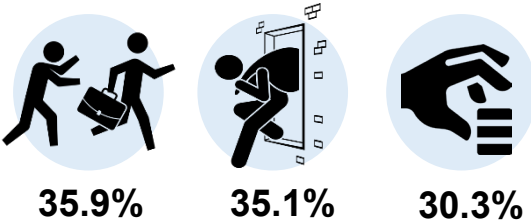
Overall, **18.7% of males** and **13.4% of females** had reoffended

Time to Reoffence

Of those who reoffended, **over two-fifths (46.2%)** committed their first reoffence within the first **three months**; by **six months 70.9%** of those who reoffended had committed their first reoffence



Baseline Offence



Those previously convicted of **robbery** (35.9%), **burglary** (35.1%), or **theft** (30.3%) were most likely to reoffend

Adult and Youth

Adults make up **95.5%** of the overall cohort (20,373); **17.3%** of adults **reoffended**



Youths make up **4.5%** of the overall cohort (918); **24.1%** of youths **reoffended**

Disposal

Custody releases had a reoffending rate of **46.0%**

Diversions had a reoffending rate of **16.0%**



Offending History

Of the 20,373 individuals within the current cohort, **63.7%** had committed a total of **227,625 previous offences**, ranging from **one** to **455** distinct offences
